Recently some of our carers from the Kirrie/Forfar area attended a couple of craft activities at The Realm of Imagination in Kirriemuir. These events were thoroughly enjoyed by all who participated, it gave them a chance to try something different, and provided them with a break from their caring roles.

Story from a carer

A beautiful story of one our lovely carers who benefited last year from a break, through our time to live fund, below is a picture she got whilst away and a short story of why this made such a difference to her and her family, (please note all names have been changed for data protection).



Lily is a carer for her son who has a diagnosis of Autism. This is a very recent diagnosis, but the family have known for many years that this was the case.

Lily has struggled for many years with her caring role – it has been demanding on her both physically and emotionally. She has had a few breaks away with ACC through our Respitality and Time to Live in the

past, but it had been a few years since her most recent break. Before her break, she was in a battle to get her son officially diagnosed and the appropriate support that he needed after he had an attempt to take his own life. Times were very hard for Lily and her family, and she reached out to her worker to help get a break away.

Her worker helped her to complete her application and look at a break away in a beautiful cottage by the coast with her family. After the break, she contacted her worker to send some pictures of their time away and to explain the wonderful time they had as a family.

Without access to the Time to Live fund, it is unlikely that Lily and her family would have been able to fund this holiday away. Although she was still in an active caring role whilst she was away, she had the opportunity to get her son into a different environment which helped his mental health and in turn helped Lily.

Angus Young Carers 3 month snap shot

Angus Young Carers have had a busy few months. We continue to support many young carers throughout Angus, in school, and engaging in peer group activities, where they build skills, develop knowledge and have fun with their peers.

Murton Wednesday Group (8-12 years)

The young carers continue to thrive attending the Wednesday group based at Murton Farm. They have enjoyed so many different opportunities. In March they visited the Kirriemuir Fire Station and were extremely excited to be present when a "shout" to attend an actual fire occurred during their visit. They returned the following week to learn basic First Aid, all important, essential skills.

The YC have lots of fun when at Murton Farm, where they learn animal husbandry, conservation skills, adopting Terry the tortoise, and playing outdoors. We had support from Outdoor Adventures, Michelle Spink, who was funded via the Climate Hub, and introduced our young carers to using different materials to make wonderful art.



COOKING SCHOOL – Fit's Cooking -Montrose

Cooking school ran for a 4-week block finishing at the Easter Holidays. The age group was our 8-12 years old young carers. The YC made sweet potato soup and bread rolls, veggie lasagne and tortilla chips, Chicken curry and naan bread, and finishing off with an Easter themed goodies bag, featuring cheesecake inside an Easter eggshell and carrot muffins.

All the young carers had a brilliant time learning new skills and about food waste reduction and trying new flavours. Each young carer was lucky enough to receive a signed book from local author Celia Norman Smith with a goodie bag at the last session.



Brothock Shotokan Self Defence Class (13-17 year).

Our latest group activity for the 13 – 17 young carers was a six-week self-defence course facilitated by Brothock Shotokan Karate Club. Young carers met every Friday afternoon to learn all about selfprotection, assertiveness, verbal confrontation skills, safety strategies, and physical skills, all through an introduction to karate. As well as learning all this, it was a bit fun and fitness for everyone with a focus on trying out something new and enjoying themselves along the way.

Each week it was evident the skills the young carers worked on with their teachers Billy and Lilly continued to grow, as did the groups confidence in themselves. Throughout the week the group developed their punches, kicks, blocking and learned a few Katas which are choreographed movements using different skills from karate. The young carers who attended spoke positively of this experience enjoying the challenge of something new.

We are now looking at a second round of this activity for the 8 – 12year-old young carers.



The Promise Primary School - Feb -April

Support is continuing to grow and cover more areas of Angus. It has been a busy couple of months working in schools doing lots of group crafts for Mother's Day and Easter Celebrations.

A BIG thank you to the Primary schools which took part in our Young Carers Action Day competitions where we selected x 2 winners, this wasn't an easy decision because all entries were fantastic

We have now returned to schools and working towards the summer break and will continue to support all young people in school, we have planned refresher assemblies and will help prepare for p7 transitioning into Secondary school.



Angus YC High School Project – Feb - April

With the school exam term upon us it brings different challenges and stresses for YC within the High School Education Development project.

Morag remains in schools with drop-in days but as most of the senior YC are on study leave, we have the chance to offer class presentations where possible and attend parent information evenings for new S1 intake across Angus.

Along with joint working with the Promise Primary Education Development team to support P7 YC transitioning to secondary school, it's another busy term.
