up with the idea, raised £1167.21



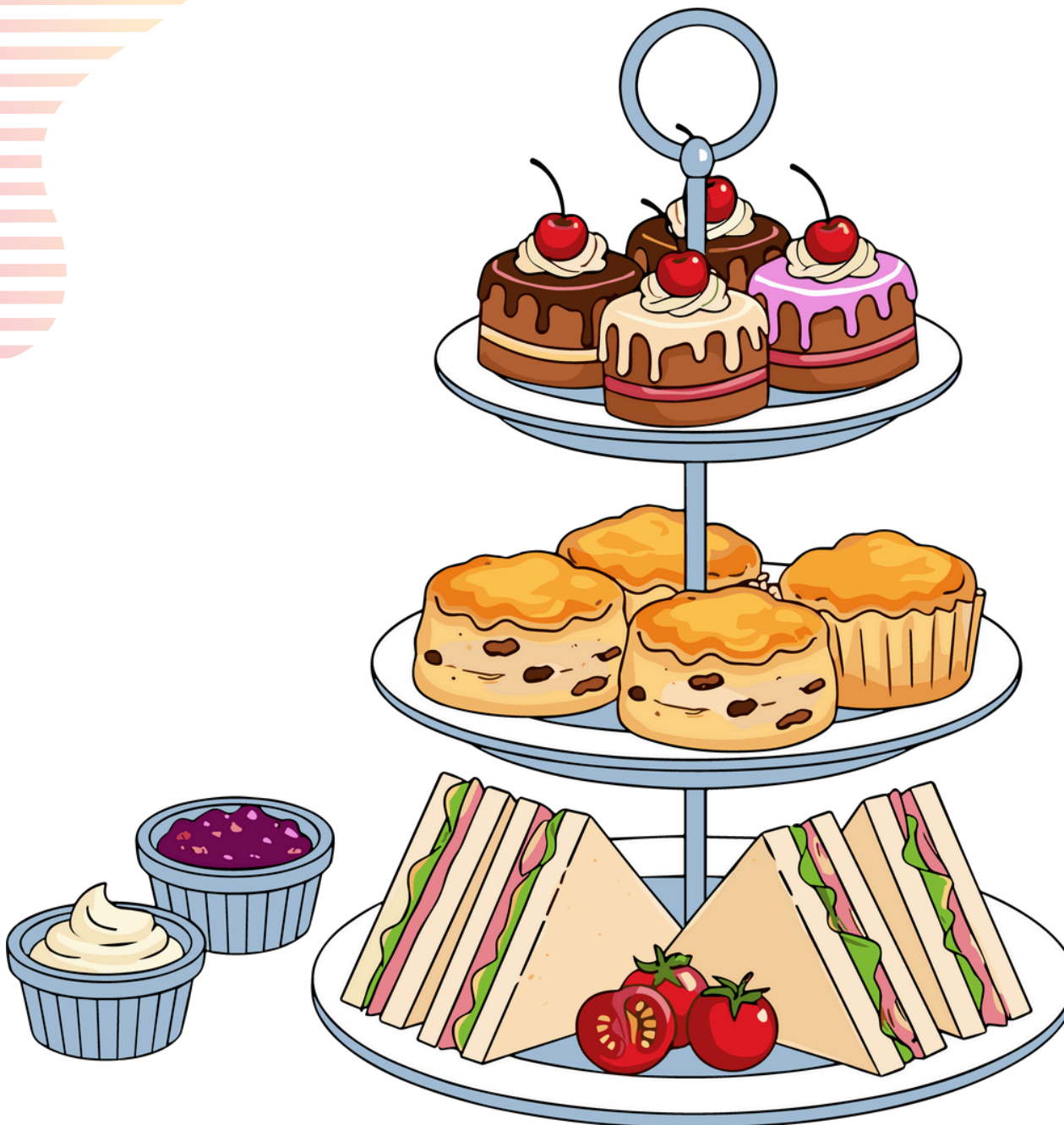


# Afternoon Tea

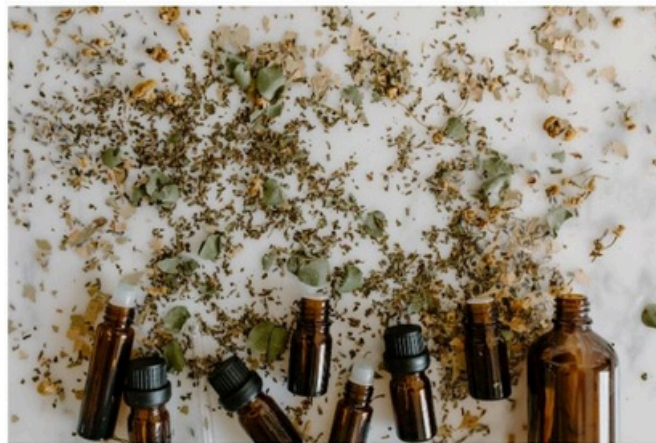
# HOSPITALFIELD

# HOSPITALFIELD

## *Herbal Solidarity*

The project will run in 3 blocks, Autumn '25, Winter/ spring '26 and Spring/ summer '26. We encourage you to sign up for the whole cycle, or a minimum of one block if you can, however if you can only make some of the sessions we have reserved some flexible spaces.

Carers are invited to join Herbalist Anna Kinross as we continue our series of workshops learning how to create simple and effective herbal remedies in the beautiful setting of the Physic Garden at Hospitalfield House. This is an opportunity to learn and connect with the garden and share skills and knowledge in a welcoming atmosphere. The winter/ spring sessions will be looking at natural remedies to support our health through the colder seasons, using what is available to us in nature over this time, and as well as plenty of hands on medicine making we will explore practices to support our wellbeing through the darker days and into early spring. All are welcome, whether you have attended previous sessions or not, and no prior knowledge is needed.

### **Access**

These workshops are designed for adult carers in Angus. You may be a parent, a son or daughter, a sister or brother or friend to someone who needs your support as a result of their illness, condition or disability.
